Then, there is the area with the monoliths with engravings and a brief background on various soldiers. The idea behind the monoliths here is to emphasize what each soldier: a man, woman, 18-50+, all ethnic backgrounds ... means to the Army family as a whole. It is well worth taking the time to read each one. There are even some which are electronic displays on the monolith which allows a few different soldiers to be displayed on the same one. There is a fantastic introduction movie that lasts approximately 15 minutes. If you go, take the time to do the one that has the full visual and sound effects. You will not regret it.



The docents broke us into two groups which was a great idea to avoid a lot of other Museum visitors. One took us from the start of the United States Army in 1775 up to the



present day. There were artifacts from every era and during that time frame which was absolutely incredible. Thankfully, our docents were in no hurry to get rid of us! They took time to answer questions and make sure that we saw not only the displays they had com-

mentary based on their experience as well as their intense knowledge of the entire museum. We had plenty of free time to go back to what we wanted to see again as well as some areas where we had not been. One of these areas was a section devoted to those who were awarded the Medal of Honor, our nation's highest military honor for those who went far beyond the call of duty. In too many cases, they gave their lives for fellow soldiers. If you can read the accounts of these heroes without emotion ... well, you can't. Soldiers who KNEW that their next action would be their last moments on earth, but they did it for their brothers/sisters in harm's way. EVERY child ... EVERY adult ... should know their stories because it is the actions of these magnificent heroes as well as every Soldier, Marine, Sailor and Airman who have given us the freedoms too often taken for granted.



When you do have an opportunity to go to the museum, make sure that you ask when the standard group docent tour is going to happen has it will take you 45 minutes to one hour to give you a good overview of the museum. Fortu-



nately, we ended up with at least 1 1/2 hours. If you have the rest of the day, it will be a wonderful experience. Our tour ended at approximately 1 PM. At that time, we left the museum and headed over for lunch at the Yard House at Springfield Mall. If you are a fan or connoisseur of beer, they have an amazing wall of beer taps to test out!






MIKE AND DICK'S MOST EXCELLENT ADVENTURE





house. When Mike returned, we started our Texas Hill Country adventure, discovering the Lucky Rabbit, our first Texas honky-tonk with live music and great burgers!






Point Venture is in Texas Hill Country on the shore of Lake Travis. It seems the biggest share of the population is deer, lots and lots of deer!!! The near-





Subject: Free C-6, C-7 and C-8 Exhaust Systems

June 2, 2022

I have again made contact regarding having free exhaust systems (CAT back) installed on C-6, C-7 and C-8 Corvettes at Corvettes at Carlisle. At this time, I do not have complete details, but have been told there will be between eight and ten systems installed.

The deal is simple: You would need to take your Corvette to Corvettes at Carlisle on Wednesday, August 24, 2022 after lunch to have the system installed. Then on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday you would need to have the vehicle at Carlisle from 8:30 AM until 5:00 PM. You can either drive back and forth each day, or just leave it at Carlisle, which would be my recommendation as it will be parked under a large tent. Your vehicle will not be driven but will be started so prospective customers can hear the exhaust sound. I was told that systems to be installed will be from Billy Boat, Borla, Corsa, and Magnaflow and possibility one other manufacturer.

I will not have complete details until early August on the model mix, number of vehicles, or the number of systems from each manufacturer.

Whoever gets a system will be on a first come, first served basis. If you are interested, let me know ASAP. <u>I must know: Year, Coupe or Convertible, Base, Grand Sport, Z-06 or ZR-1, Manual or Automatic</u>. This is a great deal as you will be receiving an exhaust system installed that will have a value in excess of \$1,500.00 at no cost to you.
