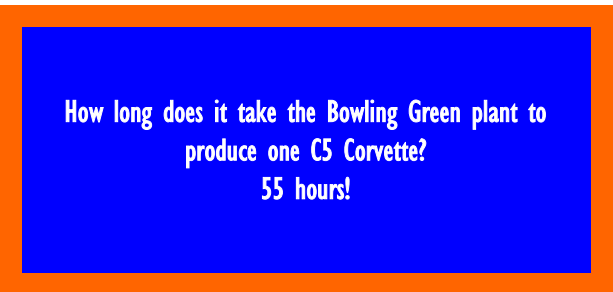

Hello Corvette Fans!
Greetings from a warm and hot Finland! What a summer we have had here, not usual! Hot since April! I am sorry that I have not sent you the picture of our vette—'89 earlier!!! But here is a photo of the "american sportcar nr 1", and this time it is in Finland! I do not have pics to send on email so that is why you receive a photo so late, hope you enjoy it! Car is '89 coupe, red/red, with a little extra on, as you can see, I like it. Underhood is some chrome details as inside, wood and some other things, Engine is original but throttle body air foil and Kbd stainless mufflers (not in picture), nice sound! Had a red/red/ '86 when I was 21, I am 28 now.
We do not drive much, around 1500km this season, and now it is already August, and vette season is between April and October. But we have four other cars so the vette is only a hobby car with 38 thousand miles on now. Nice to have it cleaned in the garage too. A C5 FUEL SYSTEM CHANGE

Those of you who own a C5 produced after VIN number ending in 35114929, built on November 22, 2002, are driving the Corvette of the Future! GM engineers were able to improve on the C5's (future C6) fuel system with newly designed tanks, quieter fuel pump, and greatly improved fuel gauge measuring system. There were so many items replaced with this new C6 design that a SPECIAL RPO code FFS was assigned to the new system. Every C5 from the above VIN forward will have this new enhanced system. In addition, this new fuel system is also being incorporated into the Cadillac XLR.

Meeting Start: 7:30 p.m. Introductions were made by everyone.

Attendance: 15 Council + 10 Members + 9 guests = 34

President's Report: Please don't park in named spaces! NEWS: Koons has 0% financing for 72 months on any in-stock Vette ordered from factory (you pay MSRP).

Rallye Director. Barb Shaw reported that the May 4th Rallye was sponsored by Andre—see May Newsletter article. Dick Hammaker is hosting the next one on Sunday June 22nd. Don't forget cruise option for \$5. Also Poker hand option splits 50/50.

Treasurer's Report given by Jeff Reinke.

Autocross. Mike Sarver reported that June 30th was still on for Capital Area Austin Healy Club Convention. Some NVCC folks went to Beaverun – great track, 1.6 miles, 12 turns, nice changes in elevation. Downside: fairly new track, so not many amenities (The pits are the pits). Jim Beaupre volunteered to add other local racing events in the calendar in the newsletter. Zoel Robinson reported that he, Andrej, and Wanda went to Lancaster the weekend of the picnic. Zoel had FTD in the 1st event with 56.2 seconds; Wanda ran 58.2; Andrej ran 58.5. In 2nd Autocross Zoel had 2nd FTD and Wanda beat all the other men! SCCA moved to FedEx field. NVCC had set up a tentative ODS meeting with John Tribble & Paul & ODS folks to set up autocross dates for this year—still working on this.
