GROOVIN' and VIEWIN' IN YOUR VETTE!

Everyone knows how fun it is to drive a Corvette, and some of us know it's fun just to watch. Some people video-tape their driving to record the event. "How did I look out there?" Others tape in order to improve their technique. Here are some of the ways that people save their video projects.

Most people are recording with video cameras that use the smaller cassettes. This is practical because it allows the camera to be compact. Seldom do you need to record for extended periods while driving, so the smaller tape capacity is no problem.

Many digital video cameras allow direct downloads to the hard drive of a computer. This can be a convenient way of storing and organizing your tapes. Transferring the project requires software provided with the camera, or an adapter with aftermarket software.

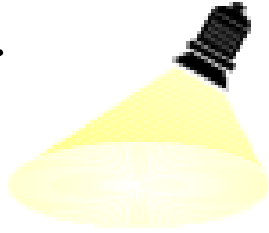
Cameras that record directly to a CD-Rom are expected to be on the market soon. This will be convenient, as the CD can be played on any computer with compatible software. It will also be more expensive, as are most new gadgets.

For those of us without the capacity for direct CD recording, there is still a way of saving your tape digitally without having to go to a graphics studio. There are adapters that connect the USB port on your computer to an output jack on your camera. These adapters cost between \$50 and \$100, depending on the store and the software that comes with it. The device that I use is called "Instant video" (ADS TECHNOLOGIES / USB INSTANT VIDEO W/USB CABLE AUDIO/VIDEO CABLE & SOFTWARE (mfg part #USBV-170)) and was purchased from <http://www.thenerds.net>. It is also available at several other sites, including <http://www.techdepot.com> and <http://www.shopharmony.com>. There are probably other similar adapters that perform the same function, but the software will be the most important consideration for your purchase. I got the best price at the Nerds, and received the product within 3 days of my order. But the software I got was the basic version of Ulead Studios video editing software. It has the capacity to convert If you have the need for more powerful editing, there are software upgrades available. For any video project that involves your computer, you need a big hard drive and lots of RAM. The packages have their own recommendations, but a hard drive > 10MB, a processor of P-III or better, and 256 MB RAM should get you started.

If you have the need to see (and hear) for yourself how that titanium exhaust on the Z06 sounds @ 4,500 rpm, you will enjoy being able to save, share, and archive your accomplishments in digital format.

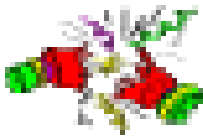

NVCC Business Meeting Minutes – January 28, 2003

Meeting Start: 7:30 p.m.

Attendance: 15 Council + 18 Members + 4 guests = 37

NCCC Convention 2003 Report: George Gallant, Convention Director, was our special guest. He stated that everyone should have gotten their 2003 membership packets—be sure to return the form for your new bylaws. Also, National has invited everyone to June Corvette Caravan in Nashville – they have 250 spaces for the car show. (See the NCCC web site www.corvettesnccc.org for registration form - closes Feb. 28th or www.Corvette50th.com for info).

2003 Convention Details (see www.ernccc.org for details & registration forms). George showed the video promoting the 44th NCCC Convention, Hagerstown, MD, August 15-21st, (followed by Corvettes at Carlisle). He pointed out that the location is perfect—both low speed & high speed autocross can be run simultaneously (at Summit Point); banquet facility at the Clarion can hold 1200 people. We have 160 of their 400 rooms blocked - get registration in early to stay at Clarion (must stay 5 nights if choose Clarion). Some highlights:

- If you're running your car, he suggested that you come up Friday for tech. All 500-600 cars will be teched in breezeway in service lane of Chevy dealer; they'll have a fast tech for rallyers.
 - Saturday will be busy: Registration & Tech. Lunch picnic hosted by Goodyear; (condensed) National meeting in afternoon, followed by Drivers meeting for entire group—all chairs will speak to speak; Evening: 'Gaz' (Stevie Wonder impersonator)
 - Sunday. Can still register & tech. Morning car show at Hoffman Chevy (200 cars expected); Parade in afternoon—downtown Hagerstown Historic District (106 cars expected—2/year). Special prizes will be awarded if enter parade. After parade, downtown in square: 50's/60's party under the stars, includes party, 4 bands, soft drinks, food, hosted by Firestone. Plan to get you back to hotel by 9-10 p.m.
