BACC Autocross By Mike Sarver

April 18th the Bel Air Corvette Club held an NCCC double autoX at the Baltimore GM parking lot. NVCC was well represented with Wanda and Zoel Robinson, Andrej Balanc and Mike Sarver.

Convoing up with Zoel and Wanda in the lead, Andrej and then Mike. (Wanda was the only one smart enough to bring directions to the track) We were coming out of the Harbor Tunnel when smoke started coming out from under Zoel's truck. Two or three hundred yards later, we are getting water spray on the windshield. ("hmmmm, not smoke, water or steam, must be overheating")

Zoel takes the next exit which by chance is the one we needed and pulls over. It seems that the block heater where it goes into the freeze plug on the driver's side rear of the block is pushed out. Zoel gets under the truck and tries to push it back in. The rest of us are trying to figure out how far we are from the track. People going to the autocross start pulling over and asking if they can help. (Imagine the scene with 3 trailer vettes pulled over on the side of the street.)

Andrej and Mike take off to the event and unload. Drop Mike's trailer and head back. Put Zoel's truck on Andrej's trailer, Mike pulls Zoel's trailer and Wanda drives their race Vette the five blocks to the GM lot! Zoel heads out to find a parts store that is open and returns to install the freeze plug and all repairs completed before the first heat is over! Who says NVCC'rs aren't industrious?

Mike, normally a high speed guy, is starting to get the hang of these parking lot autocrosses. As usual Andrej, Zoel and

Wanda were kicking some serious booty.

The GM lot is in good shape and better to run on than Rosecroft. The two events each had 3 heats. So each heat ran their two events (3 runs clockwise and then 3 runs counter clockwise. The course had a number of tight corners (box corners) and a really tight start and finish, basically a 1st gear course. Mike ran in the first heat, Wanda ran in the 2nd and Andrej and Zoel ran in the 3rd.

It was hard getting the tire temps up in the morning and with 400 rwhp in 1st gear, it was like trying to play basketball on an ice rink. After Mike's 1st run, he ran the entire course in 2nd and dropped 6 seconds off his time. On his 2nd run down into the 53s and feeling good as he pulled FTD. (That lasted for about 2 minutes.)

Of the two events Wanda nailed Ladies FTD in one and Zoel flew to Men's FTD in one. Overall NVCC put on a respectable showing.

It was like an 'old home' week... of lots of people from Spooktacular. Karen Ross, Tim Erdman, John Priestner, Dave and Sally Walter, etc.,

There must have been 5 or 6 people that asked about ODS. A couple of them were like "Hey you're from Northern Virginia right? I came down to one of your club events at Old Dominion and loved it. Are you going to do it again?"

Another guy... "The first event I ran was with you guys at ODS last year. I've run 11 events since then and can't get enough. I'm getting my NCCC high speed license so I can make it to your event in October. Do you have dates for ODS yet? It felt like you were driving in a mixing bowl. I loved it!"

**Z06 Electron Blue Zone by
Jim Beaupre**

I had two different experiences over the last month that readers might find interesting.

The first involved an advertisement seen on television and some print media related to a Mr. Clean (the household cleaner people) and their new Auto Dry Car Wash system. Well if you are one of those people who that takes a cham- ois then two towels after washing to get dry, any product that promised a no wipe system to dry the car seemed to be worth a try.

Home Depot had the system on "sale" for about \$20. The box promised, "wash your car and rinse with no wiping dry, water just beads off". Ok let's see.

After getting home I discovered the "system" consisted of a large plastic handle to attach to your hose, liquid car soap that looked like dish soap and a water filter to go in the plastic handle. The idea is to put the soap and filter in the handle, set the handle on one of three settings: rinse no filter, wash with soap, and rinse with filter. Following directions I put the soap and filter into the filter and set on rinse to wet the car, set on wash which generated a lot of suds that then had to be scrubbed by hand and then rinsed through the filter. The key is the filter and maybe the soap. The instructions said "only use Mr. Clean soap".

Well it did work kinda... It was tough to soap all the car and then rinse with the filter on. When in filter mode only a light spray comes out of the handle as the filter is purifying the water. I did not have to dry off, the water just beaded off leaving no water spots.

Problems. Filter is only supposed to last two washes and soap only lasted two. Buying a new filter and soap, both stated to last 10 washes was another 15 bucks. Slooow rinsing the cars. Another problem we noticed was when it rained a few days later the windshield of both cars was streaking. As we are big user of Rain-x we were surprised and guessed it must be the soap/rinse residue. Which I noticed kind of a slimy residue on the soap sponge.

Bottom line is I probably will only use on colder days when I am too lazy to wipe the car down and looking to give a quick wash. Pricey too.

My other experience was with Kuhmo tires this month. Looking to upgrade the old Z06 with new Kuhmo 710's for the Autox season I ordered and had the tires mounted. On the day I picked them up Kuhmo announced that they were recalling all the 710s. Seems a group of racers were finding the tires coming apart at the tread after 6 or 7 laps at Road Atlanta! Here is what Kuhmo did: replaced the 710s with 700s within 4 days and committed to providing new 710s within 90 days when the production problem is fixed! Good deal ! Two sets of tires for the price of one ! Will let you know if they come through with the second set.

The sunny season has begun, go out and exercise your Vette at a club event!

Corvette Takes Third Consecutive GTS Victory at Sebring

The Corvette Racing team took an impressive flag-to-flag GTS victory at the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring. Ron Fellows, Johnny O'Connell and Max Papis claimed the class victory in the #3 Corvette C5-R. "This is an historic race and it is great for us to win here three times in a row," said Doug Duchardt, director of GM Racing. "Sebring was our nemesis in the beginning of our program and we've really put a lot of effort into developing the Corvette for this track. The #3 Compuware Corvette C5-R of Ron Fellows, Johnny O'Connell and Max Papis started Saturday's race from the GTS pole position, 10th overall, after qualifying at a record-setting 1:57.052. The trio briefly surrendered the lead to the partner #4 Corvette C5-R, but again took over the lead on lap 30 and held on for the remaining 299 laps. With Sebring's victory, O'Connell becomes the first driver in the 52-year history of Sebring International Raceway to capture six class wins, with one of them overall in 1994.
