This is a low speed event with a series of exercises designed to teach you car control under different conditions, and then to put those skills to use on Summit Point's Jefferson circuit. The cost of this event is \$150 and worth every penny! This event will also be of help to people that are interested in getting started in high speed events! Now for the really exciting news!! NVCC will be holding three high speed track days this year! We have been able to get a day on all three tracks at Summit Point this year.
