Hi everyone ... well, a couple of months of preparation made for a great day at National Harbor. The Horizon Day Camp for kids with cancer has become a reality in Northern Virginia and open to all area kids!! The first was established in New York. There are now 10 of the very special camps across the country with the hope for more in the future. Each camp has the same goal: to provide a special experience for kids with cancer in an environment where scars, baldness, feeling queasy after meds and more is simply understood and not a concern. Kids going to this special camp get a chance to be themselves and, for many, it's the first time that it may happen. There's a medical team that specializes in pediatric oncology needs. Camp counselors are trained in the needs of the kids who range in age from 3-16. Also, a sibling can go even if not with cancer in order to make it easier for some kids to go. Best of all, the families of the attendees do not pay anything! With the hell of having a child with cancer, the idea of one less thing on their mind is fantastic.



So, with the last item in mind, it was an honor to be able to represent NVCC and the Optimists at this function. I know that it was not an official club sponsored event especially as we have active charitable duties. But, I sincerely appreciate the fact that George Durk gave an ok to ask members for voluntary donations. Our arrival at National Harbor was at 8:30am. It was nice to be met by club member, Lauri Stevens, who lives there. She graciously made parking available and drove us to the meeting point. By the time registration was done, there was a Walkathon group of @ 200 people including camp attendees and family and friends plus others like Carol and I who were there to help. Part of the effort was personal as Carol lost a nephew to leukemia at age 8 after his 6 year battle with it. Since that time, there has been a magnificent and successful effort to reduce the fatality rate.

NVCC'S JUNE 5 CHANTILLY CORVETTE SHOW

The first weekend of June is NVCC car show time and did we have a doozie this year. We surpassed our biggest show by 100 pct... And it came off like clockwork despite the fact that everything was new... new sponsor, new venue, new equipment and software, new volunteers, new logistics, marketing, and communications with multiple parties... And many new members...4 as of show-end and a list of another 17 our Membership Director, Joanna McCandless, is following-up with!

The clear, dry and sunny pleasant weather certainly helped. We had 83 pre-registrations and 70 day-of-show registrations for a total of 153 registrants. Every available space was filled and then some, lining Corvettes up in the middle of the largest parking area.

We had some notable attendees as well:

Multi-millionaire Les Sorensen, the man who built Lake Ridge VA, came with his pristine C1. Greg and Terry coordinated and trailered in their Vettes from WVA. Greg has the C8-R almost an exact replica of GM's international race car... If he didn't have it installed already, it is slated to receive twin turbos. Terry Shanholtz, Best of Show winner, is a C2 Corvette restorer. He has won the Celebrity Judges award for his restorations over a half dozen times. His family is a well-known name in the Romney area going back over 100 years. There were multiple NCRS quality Vettes there, including our own Evelyn McKay's pristine '90. The white #6 C1 "tanker" raced at Sebring in the 60s. The owner has 20 Corvettes.

Between registrations, raffles and 50/50, we raised \$5,500 for Pohanka Chevrolet's designated local charity, Western Fairfax Christian Ministries Food Bank. With Pohanka Chevrolet's additional \$1,000, a \$6,500 check was presented to the charity.



PENTAGON SEPTEMBER 11 MEMORIAL AND USAF MEMORIAL VISIT

Everyone in our club went through the horror of September 11. Since DC was part of the worst that happened, many of us were specifically affected. If anyone in the Club lost a family member or friend, I am truly sorry. Our docent for the visit was Dave Nanney, an Army veteran of Vietnam who ended up at the Pentagon on 9/11/01. He shared info that was historic but, more importantly, info that was personal as he had friends who were among the wounded and killed. Dick Hammaker, USAF fighter pilot, Vietnam veteran, was able to relate to a lot of it as he knew some of the same people as Dave plus have the intense feel of the Pentagon from his experience. The day was a lot like 21 years ago -- blue skies and innocent to the casual observer. In DC, it did not become hell until 9:37AM when American Airlines 77 hit the Pentagon.



I'm not sure how to write the rest of the newsletter article without interjecting personal experience. It's not like a track day story, a ride to the NCM or a winery. For me, the visit to the Pentagon had a personal tone which I had avoided for 21 years. I looked at what Dave presented on the path of the aircraft -- the speed of it...almost 600 mph or roughly 900 ft. per second. The aircraft was at "break up speed". As you look at the USAF Memorial from the Pentagon area where the aircraft hit, it was only a few seconds. The

sheer terror faced by the passengers as they watched the ground speed go by is unimaginable as they knew what was about to happen. I looked at the track of the aircraft, the blue sky and the face of the Pentagon that became a part of our history. I looked at the memorial benches of those whose names are on them ... some from the aircraft and the ones from the Pentagon... young kids as well as seniors. Those on vacation; those on business .. those of the flight crew. It was incomprehensible to me that almost 21 years ago, I was in the air traffic control radar room at Dulles Airport. I had been in the break room as the second aircraft was shown on TV hitting the World trade Center. We were still working aircraft departing and arriving Dulles. One of the aircraft that had recently left was American Airlines 77. A fellow controller gave a frequency change to AAL 77 : "contact Washington Center .. good luck" . Only when we heard the transcripts ad infinitum did we realize the transmission that was made. It has haunted a lot of us as it was a very unusual way to sign off with a crew. Not much later, the first aircraft had hit the Trade Center. Then , the second and shortly after it, we got word that AAL 77 had been hijacked. No one knew where the aircraft was as the hijackers had turned off the transponder which allows ATC to see the call sign and critical performance data of the aircraft. But at around 9:30 am, we saw a "fast mover" streaking across the radar screens... a blip moving at fighter speed. I called over to DCA tower to alert them to it and, at 900 feet per second, it approached DC. In suspended animation, I watched as I talked with my counterpart at DCA. He stopped talking ... I saw the target disappear - then reappear so quickly that I truly thought maybe it was a USAF fighter that was now over the DC area. Sadly, it wasn't ... the hijacker had missed his angle of attack, pulled up and came back around over what is now the USAF Memorial and straight towards the Pentagon. A few seconds later, my guy at DCA said: "They hit the Pentagon". I made the announcement ... all of us were numb. The word about the United 93 flight was also coming in. Finally, we stopped all ATC flight ops across America.

When I went to Dulles the next day, there wasn't an aircraft in the sky. Dead silence. I talked with the FBI who were at Dulles to interview anyone "involved". It was simple - explain what you had seen. I told them - then the realization that I had not been able to do a damn thing to help save anyone. I cried like many others when I said it. In ATC, the passengers are the pilot's responsibility ... but the pilots are mine. There is a camaraderie between pilots and controllers that is rare ... like firefighters and EMTs, doctors/nurses. I've flown in the cockpit with them, joked on frequency, pushed the envelope on what could work because I trusted them ... and yet, on September 11, I couldn't do a damn thing. I had lost pilots on frequency twice in my career ... once in the USAF and once with FAA. But there were reasons for it ... bad weather and a mechanical failure on an aircraft. I had doz-



ens and dozens of emergencies as well as "saves" where I had helped pilots out of a jam. But none of it mattered when I was sitting with the FBI ... my job, my responsibility, my bond was taken away from me by scum of the earth. Unlike others in the Club, I had never had a shot fired at me while in the military. I had not lost a friend. September 11 was my only day in a combat situation.

So, having avoided going to the Pentagon Memorial, last week, with friends, I was now there looking at the path, the benches and the Pentagon. I went to the bench of the AAL 77 Captain to pay my respects. I'm glad that Dave Nanney made it easy by sharing his experiences and emotions. He told me to be myself and not be ashamed to cry. So, I quietly shed a public but hidden tear at the Captain's bench. I still think about 9/11 when I see a 757 or 767 aircraft. But I'm glad that I had that opportunity ... took the opportunity offered ... to make the visit. It was good to be with friends even though they had no idea why I wanted ... needed ... to go. Our visit to the USAF Memorial as well as lunch - to which we invited our new friend, Dave, were a return to normalcy. I will simply say that Dave did a wonderful job with history and reality. If you have not been to the Memorial, it is somber but well worth it. Thanks for letting me share a story.







Subject: Free C-6, C-7 and C-8 Exhaust Systems

June 2, 2022

I have again made contact regarding having free exhaust systems (CAT back) installed on C-6, C-7 and C-8 Corvettes at Corvettes at Carlisle. At this time, I do not have complete details, but have been told there will be between eight and ten systems installed.

The deal is simple: You would need to take your Corvette to Corvettes at Carlisle on Wednesday, August 24, 2022 after lunch to have the system installed. Then on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday you would need to have the vehicle at Carlisle from 8:30 AM until 5:00 PM. You can either drive back and forth each day, or just leave it at Carlisle, which would be my recommendation as it will be parked under a large tent. Your vehicle will not be driven but will be started so prospective customers can hear the exhaust sound. I was told that systems to be installed will be from Billy Boat, Borla, Corsa, and Magnaflow and possibility one other manufacturer.

I will not have complete details until early August on the model mix, number of vehicles, or the number of systems from each manufacturer.

Whoever gets a system will be on a first come, first served basis. If you are interested, let me know ASAP. **I must know: Year, Coupe or Convertible, Base, Grand Sport, Z-06 or ZR-1, Manual or Automatic.** This is a great deal as you will be receiving an exhaust system installed that will have a value in excess of \$1,500.00 at no cost to you.
